### Transforming Miracles

**EL SALVADOR:** During 2011, 99 women accepted Christ as Savior in the Single Mothers Ministry led by missionary Elsie Moody in Santa Ana. “The testimonies of life transformation are exciting,” says Moody. “More than 300 women were physically, emotionally or spiritually healed, and 16 marriages were restored.” Women reported miracles of provision, and several who were contemplating suicide found renewed hope for their lives.

Realizing that 67 percent of mothers in the nation are single and 30 percent of teenage girls become pregnant, Moody began training workers for the ministry in 2010. Today 32 single mothers groups serve about 600 mothers and 1,000 children in Santa Ana.

“Single moms need to know that Jesus loves them unconditionally and that there’s hope in Christ,” says Moody. 

### A Lasting Cure

### Presenting God’s Truth


**WEST AFRICA:** Missionary Jim Byh and national OneHope teams reached many people in the French-speaking countries of Africa with the gospel in 2011. Lives were changed as God used school assemblies, kids clubs, church planting teams and the *GodMan* film as platforms to present His Word.

Byh reports that

- 4.5 million people received *Book of Hope* in school outreach programs.
- 670,815 viewed the *GodMan* film.
- 178,206 prayed with a OneHope team member to receive Christ and are now connected to a local church.
- More than 30 churches were planted in unreached areas.

“The enemy of our souls is using many weapons to destroy the next generation,” says Byh. “But the solution for reaching young people in West Africa is presenting God’s eternal truth.”

“A real move of God is occurring among Gypsies,” says missionary Joseph Lear. Each Sunday morning, 1,000 Gypsies meet in a tent in Leskovac for worship. The congregation also has planted several churches in surrounding towns and villages. “We are thankful that God has given us an opportunity to be a part of this work,” says Lear.
